THE RULES OF: SHEVA

The general rule of the Sheva is that it doesn't make a sound. It is sleeping, unless it is woken up.

"Sheva Nuch" – Sleeping Sheva: doesn't make a sound.

"Sheva Na" – Awake Sheva: sounds like I, BI (as in big), etc.
